Joe Pye Weed	<i>Eupatorium fistulosum</i>	pink	July/October	sun or partial sun	moist or wet	Attracts butterflies
Carolina Jasmine	<i>Gelsemium Sempervirens</i>	yellow	March/April	sun or partial sun	moist or wet	Evergreen vine
Rose Mallow	<i>Hibiscus Moscheutos</i>	pinkish-white	4-6 weeks, May/Sept.	sun or partial sun	moist or wet	Huge flowers
Blue Flag	<i>Iris Virginica</i>	lavender-white	3-4 weeks, March/May	sun or partial sun	moist or wet	Insect nectar plants
Gay Feather	<i>Liatris Spicata</i>	rose-purple	4 weeks, July	sun	moist or wet	Strongly vertical
Cardinal Flower	<i>Lobelia Cardinalis</i>	red	4 weeks, Aug/Sept.	partial sun/shade	moist or wet	Attracts hummingbirds
Coral Honeysuckle	<i>Lonicera Semperurens</i>	scarlet	8-12 weeks, May/Sept.	sun or partial sun	moist	Attracts hummingbirds
Passion Flower	<i>Passiflora Incarnata</i>	blue to purple	3 months, May/Sept.	sun or partial sun	dry or moist	Edible fruit

Summer Phlox	Phlox Paniculata	pink	3 months, June/Oct.	sun or partial sun	moist	Attracts butterflies
Obedient Plant	Physostegia Virginiana	pinkish lavender	5 weeks, Aug./Nov.	sun or partial sun	moist or wet	Aggressive
Blackeyed Susan	Rudbeckia Fulgida	yellow	6-8 weeks, July/Oct.	sun or partial sun	moist	Goldstrum is best
Wild Petunia	Ruellia Humilis	lavender	6-8 weeks, June/Sept.	sun	dry or moist	Attracts butterflies
Blue Eyed Grass	Sisyrinchium Angustifolium	blue	4-5 weeks, March/June	sun or partial sun	moist	Attracts bees
Spiderwort	Tradescantia Virginiana	bluish-purple	6-10 weeks, April/July	sun or partial sun	any	Many cultivars
Yucca	Yucca Filamentosa	white	4 weeks, April/Aug.	sun or partial sun	dry or moist	Golden Sword is best
Inland Sea Oats	Chasmanthium Latifolium	green	fruit, July/February	sun or partial sun	moist or wet	Great seed heads
